
What's On @ Burrinja



Welcome to Burrinja

There is such an exciting and diverse line up of events across arts, performance and community in 2013 that it is hard to know where to start!

The theatre season traverses the classic, the new, the funny and the dramatic. There are big names like Henri Szeps in *It's My Party* and John Wood in David Williamson's iconic *The Club*, as well as contemporary social commentary in *Boxman* from Melbourne's Big West Festival and a spellbinding Australian premier of Shelley's *Frankenstein* by Ensemble Theatre, touring after a London sell-out. The *Melbourne Comedy Festival Roadshow* will be providing a load of laughs, and the farewell tour of the popular stage production of *Possum Magic* promises to be a special event for all ages.

Our Burrinja Gallery program focuses on Indigenous culture and country, further establishing Burrinja as a significant, national public gallery of excellence for the development of Indigenous exhibitions, programs and education. The Jarmbi Gallery not only features exhibitions by some of the best artists creating new work in the Dandenong Ranges (including VCE students), but is the key venue for a visiting group of Arlpwe artists from Ali Curung (NT), talking about their country and demonstrating their work.

Burrinja continues to work behind the scenes developing and producing a number of the region's key cultural events. Highlights in the first half of 2013 are the *Dandenong Ranges Open Studios* weekend – moving a month earlier to 27 and 28 April – and the *Belgrave Lantern Parade* on Saturday 22 June – bringing the streets of Belgrave alive. Our thanks to Yarra Ranges Council for their support of all these events and of Burrinja.

The Blues and Roots nights have now become as much a part of the regular Burrinja Café music program as the Ranges Folk Club nights, and both have an excellent line up of Friday nights coming your way for settling in with dinner, wine and great vibes.

[Opening lines:] RON: At 10.23pm on January 24, my doctor gave me three months to live. By my calculations, that leaves me with exactly...111 minutes. So Dawn's invited the kids around for party pies and Pavlova.

Gruff, well ordered, quintessentially Aussie family man Ron is convinced he is dying so he hosts a party, giving his wife and children the chance to spend a few last quality moments as a family. The gathering brings about some urgent confessions, a surprise 'wedding', and a visit from the undertaker. As the minutes tick away, Ron's party schedule unravels to reveal a dysfunctional family unit that is both outlandishly bizarre and utterly recognisable.

Starring Henri Szeps (*Mother and Son*) and Robyn Arthur (*The Boy from Oz*), Elizabeth Coleman's deliciously funny and sweetly dark play is a tale of anxiety, absurdity and occasionally terror. Like all great comedies, there is laughter...but the elbow jabbing at your ribs is that little bit sharper than expected.

Frankenstein

Mary Shelley's classic tale re-imagined in a spine-tingling new version – not for the faint-hearted.

Frankenstein is an astonishing adaptation and it was a huge hit for the National Theatre, London in 2011. The play gives the Creature a voice – this is a Creature that talks, that can be articulate about the way he feels – and the way he feels is very angry.

A troupe of actors arrive to put on a play of Frankenstein. These actors dance, juggle, act, tumble. They set the bare stage: a scenic design capturing the gothic darkness of Mary Shelley's novel; flaming torches light the back walls; actors exit and enter the acting circle, while other actors watch their scenes; make up is applied; blood, dirt; a cello player, half human, half creature plays stirring music; the creature comes to life in a burst of light and steam; the images of anatomy flash on back walls; heartbeats pound in the darkness... another flash of light ... the creature tries to speak! And the play begins...

Lajamanu: Early Paintings

28 February - 12 May

An exhibition of paintings by Walpiri men and women from the remote Aboriginal community of Lajamanu, 500km northwest of Alice Springs, takes the visitor back to the beginning of acrylic painting in Central Australia. This exhibition brings together rarely seen canvasses which intrigue with their 'purity', a raw creativity, which is free from commercial influences and market forces.

Imaginary Ornithology

2 March - 12 May

An interactive sound installation by Peter McIlwain which invites participants to discover and describe the sounds of imaginary birds in the Field Guide to Imaginary Birds of the Dandenong Ranges – a multi-channel sound installation at Burrinja which is truly a work of art for creative listening. Green Desert

17 May - 11 August

This multimedia exhibition is a journey through time into the ancient world of Australia's desert interior, featuring low level aerial images by award winning photographer Peter Elfes. Peter has spent the last four years documenting the beauty of this rare climatic event, the flooding of Lake Eyre, Kati Thanda, in Arabuna country in South Australia.
